1. SCHOLARSHIPS

1.1. Scholar Rescue Fund Fellowships

Field of study: There are no limits on the disciplines or fields supported.

Scholarship: IIE's Scholar Rescue Fund (SRF) provides fellowship grants for scholars whose lives or careers are threatened in their home countries. The fellowships support temporary academic positions at universities, colleges and other higher learning institutions in safe locations anywhere in the world. Fellowship periods of up to one calendar year are intended to allow the scholars to continue their important work pending improvement in conditions allowing their safe return home. Fellowships may be renewed for a second and final year. Fellowships are awarded in the form of grants of up to US \$25,000. Most awards require additional financial support from the host institutions or a third-party source, support is generally equal or greater to the SRF award.

Duration: N/A

Perspective candidates: Academics, researchers, and independent scholars may qualify. In most cases, a graduate degree will be required before a fellowship is awarded. Preference is given to scholars with a Ph.D. or other highest degree in their field; who have been employed in scholarly activities at a university, college or other institution of higher learning during the last 4 years

(excluding any period of suspension, ban or prohibition); and whose selection is likely to benefit the scholarly community in the home and/or host country or region.

Closing date for applications: Applications and nominations are accepted at any time throughout the year, on a rolling basis. Applications will be considered by the SRF Selection Committee at least three (3) times per year, generally in January, April, and October. Non-emergency applications must be received at least 4 weeks before a committee meeting in order to be considered. Decisions will be announced approximately two (2) weeks after each Selection Committee meeting.

1.2. Swiss Government Scholarships for Foreign Students, Switzerland

Field of study: applied sciences

Scholarship: The scholarship is meant to cover a student's living expenses. With a scholarship of 1'920 CHF per month it largely covers the financial needs.

Description: The Swiss Government awards a range of scholarships to foreign students through the Federal Commission for Scholarships for Foreign Students (FCS): university scholarships (Swiss universities and Federal Institutes of Technology), arts scholarships (schools of music and fine arts) and scholarships for universities of applied sciences (UAS). These scholarships provide graduates from all fields with the opportunity to pursue postgraduate studies or research in Switzerland at a public funded university or recognised institution. This applies to the group of Western and Central and Eastern European countries (Belarus included) included in the scholarship pool.

Duration: postgraduate studies

Perspective candidates: Swiss Government Scholarships are for postgraduate studies only. Swiss Government Scholarships are for full time postgraduate studies (pre and post doctoral Research Fellowships, or Master degrees) in one of the Swiss Universities. Research fellowships will be given priority.

Closing date for applications: Each country has its own deadline. Please get in contact with the Swiss Diplomatic Representation in your home country in order to know their application deadline.

1.3. Scholarships for LL.M degree with a specialization in Public International Law and Human Rights, Riga Graduate School of Law

Scholarship: Each scholarship recipient will receive an amount covering tuition and fees for the LL.M study programme. An additional scholarship is allocated for travel, accommodation and incidental education expenses.

Description: The Riga Graduate School of Law announces Scholarships for an LL.M degree in Public International Law and Human Rights funded by the Open Society Institute (OSI). Eligible

students currently are invited to apply for the Riga Graduate School of Law (RGSL) Public International Law and Human Rights Programme. The programme provides expertise in Public International Law and Human Rights and also offers courses in European Law. The programme is competitive and very prestigious. The Programme is based at the RGSL located in Riga, Latvia. Scholarships are funded by the Open Society Institute in order to support students with demonstrated academic excellence in law or a comparable field of study who demonstrate commitment to work in the field of public law, human rights, or public service. Students granted a scholarship must write their master's thesis in the field of public international law or human rights. Priority will be given to students who commit to work in any of the following areas upon completion of the programme: human rights, public law and public service. Furthermore, RGSL seeks to recruit students who have worked within an organization with which OSI has a relationship already, or students who are willing to work with such an organization upon completion of the programme. In the application, students are required to provide specific detail on their expectations work in a related field upon completion of the programme.

Perspective candidates: Students that hold an undergraduate degree in law or comparable degree. It is available to individuals with bachelor's or master's degree in law or related fields (or will be awarded a degree prior to admission to the programme), obtained in at least four years long studies, if basic knowledge in law and corresponding work experience is acquired; second level professional higher education, professional bachelor's or master's degree in law or other related fields, if basic knowledge in law and corresponding work experience is acquired. Eligible countries are: Belarus, Russia, Ukraine, South Eastern Europe and Central Eurasia region.

Applicant must:

- Satisfy standard RGSL entry requirements (with respect to educational background and English proficiency);
- Have experience in the fields of public international law or human rights for a minimum of one year;
- Indicate in the application: current place of employment and specify in detail the applicant's plan to return to work in the field of public service after completing the LL.M programme.

Field of study: Economics, European Law, Public, Constitutional and Human Rights Law, International Relations, Issues relating to EU Integration, Public Policy, Public Administration.

Description: The British Government's Chevening Scholarships are among the most prestigious awards available to international students for study in the United Kingdom. The scholarships are targeted at academically gifted high-flyers who have the potential to become Belarus's leaders, decision-makers and opinion formers. Most scholarships are for postgraduate Master's degrees courses (MSc, MA, LL.M).

Duration: Lasting up to 12 months, but the option of undertaking a shorter period of study or research (minimum 3 months) is also available.

Scholarship: The scholarships are fully funded and cover return flights, course fees and living costs.

Perspective candidates: Candidates must be under 35 years of age, be citizens of Belarus and be resident in Belarus at the time of application, should already hold a higher education diploma (completed Bachelors degree is a minimum requirement), have good written and spoken English, have at least 3 years' relevant work experience in the chosen subject area.

Closing date for applications: The application process for the 2011/2012 Chevening programme was open towards the end of 2010.

1.15. The Lane Kirkland Program

Field of study: Economics and Management, Administration/management, Public Administration, Law, Social Sciences, Political Science and International Relations, Development Policy and Humanitarian Aid

Description: The Polish-American Freedom Foundation – Founder of the Lane Kirkland Scholarship Program, and the Polish-U.S. Fulbright Commission – Program Administrator, announce an open competition for candidates from Ukraine, Belarus, Russia, as well as Moldova, Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan for the Lane Kirkland Scholarships in the 2011-12 academic year. The Program is addressed to young leaders, holding MA university degrees, who are determined to be actively involved in the development of democracy, economy and civil society in their countries and the region.

Duration: The Program starts usually about September 15 with a 10-day introductory/informative course whose aim is to broaden and systematize the grantees' general knowledge of Poland's history and culture as well as its political, social and economic situation. The Program includes two semesters of study at Polish universities and 2-4 week professional internships in public and private institutions.

Scholarship: The grant: 9 months x 1.700 PLN. In addition following costs are covered: educational fees, lodging in Poland, insurance, travel to and from Poland, learning materials. Computers lent to the grantees become their property only after the grantees have fulfilled all conditions related to the scholarship.

Perspective candidates: The scholarship is addressed to individuals who are able to apply the knowledge and skills obtained in Poland to economic, social and democratic changes in their home countries, and who represent the following professional groups: civil servants, politicians, experts and employees of central and local government institutions, entrepreneurs, managers, leaders of non-governmental organizations, animators in culture and civic activity, academic teachers, researchers, journalists. Also the following eligibility criteria: citizenship and permanent residence in one of the targeted countries (individuals with a permanent residence card in Poland are ineligible), Master's degree, up to 35 years of age, Polish language proficiency or English for those candidates who select study program with English as language of instruction (then only basic Polish is required), minimum 2 years of professional experience
